



Below are some key numbers and stats related to the April 4 provincial election:

- This is Saskatchewan's 28th General Election
- There are now 61 constituencies (up three from the 2011 General Election)
- There are 821,000 eligible voters for this election
- As of the close of enumeration on Feb. 23, 2016, there are 742,843 registered voters on Saskatchewan's new permanent register of voters
- There are five days of advance voting—March 29 to April 2
- There are roughly 1,700 voting places, including nearly 1,000 regular polls and 170 advance polling locations
- More than 10,000 election workers are needed across Saskatchewan
- In the 2011 General Election, there were 190 candidates for election
- As of March 2, there are 281 Saskatchewan schools registered for Student Vote

Supplies and materials required for the April 4 election include:

- 821,000 ballots (one per each eligible voter)
- 15,940 pens
- 12,080 zip lock bags
- 8,220 name badges and lanyards
- 7,970 pencils
- 7,970 pencil grips
- 5,000 ballot boxes and voting screens
- 4,110 pencil sharpeners
- 4,110 rulers
