SASKATCHEWAN IS OUR HOME.

IT'S IMPORTANT FOR FIRST NATIONS AND MÉTIS PEOPLES TO VOTE IN PROVINCIAL ELECTIONS – TO ENSURE YOUR VOICE IS HEARD.

A VOTER MUST:

- be 18 years of age or older on or before Election Day
- be a Canadian citizen on or before Election Day
- have lived in Saskatchewan for at least six months preceding the call of the election

In order to vote, all voters must show satisfactory proof of their identity and their place of ordinary residence or have another voter whose name is on the Voters' List vouch for them.

Remember, it is one person, one vote. Aboriginal participation in provincial elections is starting to increase. First Nations and Métis leaders are urging their people to learn about the issues and “get out and vote” because those votes do count.

It is also hoped that we will have more Aboriginal candidates in future elections. Increasing Aboriginal voter turnout is one way to encourage potential leaders to run for provincial office.
