CHAPTER T-1.1

An Act respecting the Tabling of Documents and Certain Consequential and Other Amendments to Other Acts resulting from the enactment of this Act

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION

Short title

1 This Act may be cited as *The Tabling of Documents Act, 1991*.

Interpretation

2 In this Act:

- (a) “**document**” means a document that is required by an Act to be laid before the Assembly;
- (b) “**preparer**” means the department, agency, board or commission of the Government of Saskatchewan or Crown corporation that, or the person who, is required by an Act to prepare and submit a document to the presenter; and
- (c) “**presenter**” means the Lieutenant Governor in Council, member of the Executive Council or other person who is required by an Act to lay a document before the Assembly.

TABLING OF DOCUMENTS

Submission of document

3(1) Subject to subsection (2), a preparer shall submit the document, which the preparer is required to prepare and submit, to the presenter at least 30 days before the document must be laid before the Assembly in accordance with subsection 4(1).

(2) Where an Act requires a document to be submitted within a period shorter than the period mentioned in subsection (1), the preparer shall submit the document to the presenter within that shorter period.

Presenting of document

4(1) Subject to subsections (2) to (6), a presenter shall lay a document before the Assembly in accordance with the following rules:

- (a) if the period with respect to which the document is prepared ends after March 31, 1999 and on or before March 31, 2000, the document is to be laid within 210 days after the end of the period;

- (b) if the period with respect to which the document is prepared ends after March 31, 2000 and on or before March 31, 2001, the document is to be laid within 180 days after the end of the period;
 - (c) if the period with respect to which the document is prepared ends after March 31, 2001 and on or before March 31, 2002, the document is to be laid within 150 days after the end of the period;
 - (d) if the period with respect to which the document is prepared ends after March 31, 2002, the document is to be laid within 120 days after the end of the period.
- (2) Where the presenter is the Lieutenant Governor in Council, the President of the Executive Council or a member of the Executive Council designated by the President of the Executive Council shall lay the document before the Assembly.
- (3) If the Assembly is not sitting when a document is required to be laid before the Assembly in accordance with subsection (1), the presenter shall submit the document to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly.
- (4) When the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly receives a document pursuant to subsection (3), the Clerk shall, as soon as possible:
- (a) subject to subsection (5), cause a copy of the document to be delivered to each member of the Assembly; and
 - (b) make the document available for public inspection during normal business hours of the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly.
- (5) The requirement in subsection (4) to deliver a copy of a document to the members of the Assembly does not apply in the period that:
- (a) commences on the day an Assembly is dissolved; and
 - (b) ends on the day fixed for making the return to the writ for the general election held pursuant to *The Election Act, 1996* that follows the dissolution mentioned in clause (a).
- (6) If a document is submitted to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly in accordance with subsection (3), the document is deemed to have been laid before the Assembly.
